The World Cup had never seen anything like it before since it commenced in 1975.

One man, Australian batter Glenn Maxwell changed everything and created history in a way none expected.

At 91 for 7 needing a further 201 from 31.3 overs the Australians were staring at defeat with Afghanistan breathing down hard all poised to bag another goose to add to three

more already in the basket with England, Pakistan and Sri Lanka falling victim.

Like a miracle on the pitch the one-legged Maxwell made the exact number against his name, 201 the first double century by an Australian in ODI cricket.

The one-legged Maxwell battling cramps finished like a wounded animal taking Australia to victory.

Greatest ODI innings from Glenn Maxwell 201*

First batter to score a double-century for Australia in men's ODIs

First batter to score a double-century during an ODI chase

First player to score an ODI double-ton while batting at No. 3 or lower

3rd Batter with double hundreds at the men's ODI World Cup

202*Partnership: Highest partnership for the seventh wicket or lower in men's ODIs

202*Partnership: most by any team in an ODI after the fall of their seventh wicket

Second-fastest ODI double-ton in 128 balls

Only batter to score 3 CWC hundreds while batting 5 or lower
